Head of the Department of Agroecotechnology Andi Apriany Fatmawaty, Ir., M.P., education staff and students of Agroecotechnology Faperta Untirta, Manager of PT. Fitotech Agri Lestari Danu Sabda Maulana along with team and staff. The implementation of yesterday's activity was a series of MF-Kedaireka activities proposed by Dr. Zahratul Millah, SP., MSi and the team in partnership with PT. Fitotech Agri Lestari, a company engaged in the plant seed industry. "This activity in addition to providing output in the form of cooperation in the development of melon production based on Seed Production Technology, also provides opportunities for at least 22 students to learn and practice directly in companies through MBKM, KKP, and research activities. This program is one of the supporters of accelerating the student graduation process, especially in the Department of Agroecotechnology, which has an impact on increasing the IKU of departments, faculties and universities," he said.

Manager of PT Fitotech Agri Lestari revealed that PT Fitotech is a company engaged in agriculture, focusing on crop production. The production will later be traded to meet the consumer needs of the entire community. "Fitotech Agri Lestari is engaged in agribusiness of horticultural crops, such as the production of melons, salak, durian, even ornamental plants such as aglaonema, cyrtosperm, and others.

2.3. Untirta Inaugurates Certified Mother Tree Foundation Block Garden on Land Untirta Cadasari Campus



Untirta Rector Prof. Fatah said that the existence of a campus in Kadu Ela Cadasari was a mandate from the Bupati Pandeglang to become an object of research, a center of excellence for local plants and a vocational center.

"We are thinking of finding a source of funds for the development of this local Banten plant. Because nowadays mangosteen and mangosteen soursop trees are rarely found. We study at IPB so that the research runs. This became a research center

special agriculture is the flagship of Banten food," he said.

"It's amazing when in Wageningen, the Netherlands. The piece of land in Banten is taken for banana cultivation research. They diligently collect it and treating so well. Now look what we have here, We even have a lot of ground on the ground lying undeveloped. Maybe our land is too rich. So I want here to be the center of the development of the cultivation of various plants that we can import because according to people in Europe, when I went there yesterday, bananas in Indonesia are more savory, sweet and delicious.

2.4. Global Halal Industry Potential USD 3.3 Trillion



SERANG – As the country with the largest Muslim population in the world, Indonesia can only utilize 13% of the global halal industry. Even though the potential of the global halal industry is recorded at USD 3.3 trillion for 2023, even this figure is predicted to continue to increase from year to year.

This was revealed in a Public Lecture organized by Faculty of Social and Politics Untirta in the framework of the 20th Faculty of Social and Politics Untirta's Anniversary, Monday (19/06/2023). This Public Lecture invited Prof. Dr. Hj. Siti Nur Azizah, S.H., M.Hum, Head of the Halal Center Unit and Vice Rector IV UNESA. Prof. Azizah also stated that Indonesia is ranked 5th according to Global Islamic Economy (GIE) Indicator data, which measures the strength of the Islamic economy in 73 countries. Although it improved from the previous year which was ranked 10th, this figure is still below Malaysia which is ranked 1st. Even though the number of Malaysian Muslim population is far below Indonesia. Indonesia is ranked first as a consumer of halal products, not as a producer.

When presenting her material entitled Sustainable Development Roadmap: Halal Industry, Prof. Azizah explained that the concept of halal used to be a non-concern, but now it has become a global issue. According to Azizah, this issue should arise in Banten because Banten is known as an Islamic and religious area.

"In the past, there were only four halal food concepts, food did not contain pigs, slaughtered By saying bismillah, it is not guts and not blood. But the concept of halal

now it is developing because there are already many mixed ingredients. The concept of halal, especially in food, is important because food shapes a person's character in everyday life, because food mixes in our body and becomes meat," added this Unesa's Professor.

The event, which was moderated by Dr. Ing Rangga Galura Gumelar, M.Si also discussed the history and efforts of halal certification in Indonesia. This event was attended by Communication Science students as part of the public relations course. Dr. Rahmi Winangsih as a lecturer in this course stated that communication students need to know this halal concept because talking about halal is not just an industry but a lifestyle, and will be closely related to halal branding.

Leo also informed that he would open a single distributor partnership in every district / city in Banten province and prioritized for Untirta alumni.

"We have installed a rooftop solar panel of 107 KWP from a plan of 1.05 Mwp. If realized, it might become the largest rooftop among campus buildings in Indonesia. at the beginning. This is a valuable value for us," he said.

"Frankly, we still have regulatory constraints related to the PLTS system. But still we will continue to strive to develop, "he added.

Meanwhile, the Medan Industry Players Team said that his company is making innovation efforts in the field of developing environmentally friendly electricity.

"We are trying to develop PLTS providers in Asahan Medan there and in Untirta apparently have developed first. We want to know and support in its application related to Electrical or other technical distribution systems.

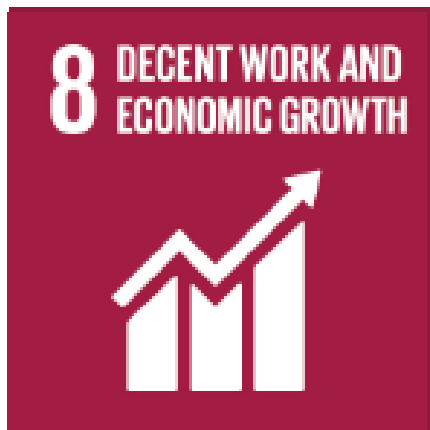

Chief Executive and Vice Rector for Student Affairs, Career Development and Alumni Relations Dr. H. Agus Sjafari, M.Si., said that IKU 1 became the spirit or important part of campus output. "IKU 1 and IKU 2 are our products. All the outputs of the activity are in

IKU 1 and IKU 2 are the most highlighted although the others are equally important. Therefore we must slumber in an effort to improve it. At this time we have to verify and validate the alumni if there are indeed those who have not," he said.

Head of Untirta Halal Center Dr. Nurprapti Wahyu Widiastuti, M.Si., explained that the current era of halal certification is different from the previous one managed by LPPOM MUI during the period of time 30 years, but currently after the existence of Law Number 33 of 2014 now the organizer of halal product jamiman is no longer in LPPOM.

"Because of what? Actually, the state is responsible for guaranteeing halal products. According to the journey, there are regulations, the law can finally be implemented. So Untirta as a state university was called and I took the initiative with the support / blessing of

campus leaders established a Halal Center. Alhamdulillah, his work has been in the 400s Micro entrepreneurs that we have facilitated to get halal certification," he explained.

"Why we are holding a competency test today is because halal human resources are a profession that does not play its responsibilities, namely the afterlife. We are also expected to become the largest halal product test center in Banten because it has large and many facilities," he added.

Dr. Nurprapti hopes that all elements on campus can support this program because it is part of how to boost IKU Untirta and can be an 'income generation' for campuses that are preparing to become PTNBH.

13.1. Striving for Net Zero Emission, Untirta Joins Energy Conservation Webinar And Climate Change



Universitas Sultan Ageng Tirtayasa (Untirta) together with 36 universities in Indonesia participated in a Webinar themed "Energy Sector and Climate Change: Issues and Strategies Towards a Sustainable Campus" organized by the UI Energy and Climate Change Team GreenMetric (UIGM) on Thursday (16/3/2023) online via Zoom Meeting.

The seminar which was opened by the Chairman of UIGM, Prof. Dr. Ir. Riri Fitri Safitri, M.Sc, M.M and Untirta Rector, Prof. Dr. Ir. H. Fatah Sulaiman, ST, MT presented three main speakers, namely Dr. Ir. Rijal Idrus, M.Sc, Dessy Ariyanti, ST, MT, P.hD, and Suci Wulan Pawhestri, M.Sc.

In the webinar, it was explained that conservation and efficient use of energy make a real contribution to mitigating climate change and global warming. The main sectors contributing the most carbon emissions today are energy and transportation. Emission (NZE), namely increasing the use of new renewable energy, increasing electrification for all sectors so that they no longer use fuel, distributing energy from new renewable energy to islands that need it most, and implementing energy savings and efficiency.

Taking place on Thursday, October 12, 2023 at

Faperta Untirta Auditorium, Untirta Sindangsari Campus, Serang Regency was attended by Vice Dean for Field 2 Faperta, Dr. H. Yudi LA Salampessy, S.E., M.Si., Head of DKP Banten Province, Eli Julianti, S.H., M.H., M.M., Program Director Kehati, Samedi, Ph.D., and representatives from PT. ASC Group.

Representing the Dean of Faperta, Vice Dean 2 of Faperta, Dr. H. Yudi warmly welcomed the guests with pleasure and pride. "Talking about mangroves, this is an iconic moment for me because that's where the interest in attraction and further education of my children arises to learn more about the benefits of mangroves in the future," said the Vice Dean 2 The Faperta.

According to Yudi, there needs to be synergy from various parties to preserve the mangrove ecosystem.

This was also concluded by the Head of DKP Banten, Eli said that DKP Banten has a program to reveal the mangrove itself.

"The activity is how we socialize to coastal communities related to disaster mitigation through mangrove planting and rehabilitation," he said.

This workshop activity is expected to be a momentum to increase synergy and effectiveness in mangrove ecosystem management in the Sunda Strait

14.2. Mitigation Efforts Against Beach Abrasion on the North Coast of Banten



One of the success stories in coastal rehabilitation efforts through mangrove planting occurred in Lontar Village, Tirtayasa District, Serang Regency, Banten Province. Ropin, a mangrove activist who lives in this village, started the mangrove planting initiative as a step to protect his pond from coastal abrasion that occurs in his area. In the past, the coastline was about 2 kilometers to the North. However, over time, beach abrasion makes the coastline in Lontar is increasingly eroded and retreats towards land. In addition, strong sea breezes also put additional pressure on the location of their ponds.

Concerned about the losses that could arise from coastal abrasion of their ponds, In the year In 2013, Ropin and his family decided to plant 500 mangrove seedlings at the site of his farm. This planting was originally aimed at protecting the pond from ongoing coastal abrasion. Initially, Ropin had experienced concerns because of mangrove seedlings What he planted did not seem to grow well. However, the hope resurfaced when mangrove seedlings began to grow new leaves.

14.3. Strengthening Mangrove Management Capacity, Untirta Brings Community Learn directly to KMPHP mangrove sari brebes



In order to increase the capacity of human resources in mangrove management, utilization and preservation, the Fisheries Science Study Program, Faculty of Agriculture, Sultan Ageng Tirtayasa University (Untirta) held a Learning Study which took place on May 8-11, 2023 at the Coastal Forest Conservation Community Group (KMPHP) Mangrove Sari Brebes, Central Java. The activity is a collaboration with the Biodiversity Foundation (KEHATI) and PT Asahimas Chemical (PT ASC Group).

Participating in the study were representatives from the Banten Provincial Marine and Fisheries Service, Banten Provincial Environment and Forestry Service, Pandeglang Regency Fisheries Service, Pandeglang Regency Environmental Service, Academics from Sultan Maulana Hasanuddin State Islamic University (UIN) Banten, Village Heads (Margasana, Panimbangjaya, Mekarsari, Cigorondong, Tamanjaya, Ujung Jaya), Mangrove Care Community Groups in Panimbang District (KOMPAKSI), and Sumur District (COMPILATION) and Tanjungjaya Village Tourism Awareness Group. Learning from KMPHP which has carried out mangrove management and utilization activities for more than 20 years, the participants gained valuable experience that mangrove ecosystems must be maintained, conserved and utilized while still prioritizing sustainability aspects. The desire to manage and conserve mangroves must come from within everyone so that groups built on common understanding will survive and thrive in the future.

Various productive economic activities can be developed in efforts to manage and utilize mangroves, including crab cultivation and enlargement, mangrove batik, boiled salt to vaname shrimp cultivation with a biofloc system. These activities are not only able to provide added economic value but also provide jobs for the surrounding community. Variations of derivative products can be developed in collaboration with various relevant stakeholders.

A maintained mangrove ecosystem can be managed into a promising ecotourism object. The development of tourism activities will have a snowball impact on various other service businesses. However, tenacity and patience are key in efforts to maintain and preserve mangrove ecosystems. Even before the Covid-19 pandemic, the existence of "Dewi Mangrove Sari" as a mangrove tourism village was able to attract various attention. Both domestic and foreign tourists with a value of money turnover reaching 3-5 billion a year.

The coastal area of Banten, especially the Sunda Strait has beautiful landscapes. The potential of mangrove ecotourism is one of the alternative activities that can be developed in the future. The increasing attention of the community and stakeholders to the existence of mangroves on the coast of the Sunda Strait, especially after the Sunda Strait tsunami must be maintained and improved. Therefore, a "Mangrove Learning Center" is needed on the coast of the Sunda Strait which will be a center for learning, development, utilization and management of mangrove ecosystems that can not only function ecologically as coastal protection, but also provide leverage for productive economic development in coastal villages of the Sunda Strait
